Lift Refurbishment at Radnor Park, Clydebank

Clydebank Housing Association recently completed a £1.4m contract to renew 14 passenger lifts at their seven multi-storey flats in Radnor Park, Clydebank.

The contract, which was awarded to Lift Maintenance Limited, commenced on site in December 2008 and was completed in November 2010.

The new lifts comply with current access regulations for people with disabilities and involved positioning push buttons at a height designed for access to people in wheelchairs and having Braille/ tactile identification plates for those with visual impairment. Infra-red door detectors were also fitted which means that any obstruction is detected and the doors will reverse without coming into contact with the person.

Bob Irvine, Contractor Administrator at Lift Maintenance Limited said, "We are delighted to have been associated with Clydebank Housing Association on this project which was completed on time, within budget and with the minimum disruption to tenants."

Alison Macfarlane, Senior Maintenance Officer at Clydebank Housing Association said, "The refurbishment programme went really well and we are grateful to all our tenants for their patience during the work. We will shortly be carrying out a survey of tenants to gauge levels of satisfaction"

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
